# Small Jack Hanging

Finished size approximately 12" x 12"

## FABRIC REQUIREMENTS:

B. Pattern #20379 – MUL1	.....	Fat Eighth
C. Pattern #20380 – LTBE11	.....	Fat Eighth
D. Pattern #20380 – YEL1	.....	Fat Eighth
F. Pattern #20380 – RED1	.....	Fat Eighth
J. Pattern #20382 – RUS1	.....	Fat Eighth
K. Pattern #20387 – BRO1	.....	Fat Eighth
L. Pattern #20380 – GRE1:	.....	small piece for leaf appliqué
M. Pattern #20380 – BRO 1	.....	1/4 yard
Backing:	.....	Fat Quarter of choice

**Additional supplies:** 1/8 yard of fusible web, two 1/4" black buttons.

The stand is Ackfeld Manufacturing's 12" x 14" single scroll stand.

## CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

### B. Pattern #20379 – MUL1 (stripe):

Cut two strips 1"; subcut two 1" x 8 1/2" and two 1" x 9 1/2".

### C. Pattern #20380 – LTBE11 (stars):

1. Cut six 1 1/2" squares.
2. Cut two 2" squares.
3. Cut one 3" x 3 1/2" rectangle.
4. Cut one 3 1/2" x 4" rectangle.

### D. Pattern #20380 – YEL1 (stars):

Applique pieces for face.

### F. Pattern #20380 – RED1 (stars):

Cut one 5 1/2" x 8 1/2" rectangle.

### J. Pattern #20382 – RUS1 (spiders):

Cut three strips 2" x longest part of fat eighth; subcut two 2" x 9 1/2" strips and two 2" x 12 1/2" strips.



### K. Pattern #20387 – BRO1 (bats):

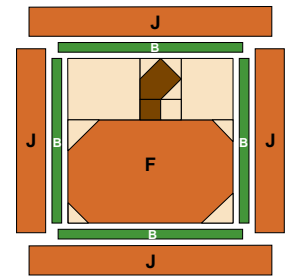
1. Cut one 2 1/2" square.
2. Cut one 1 1/2" square.

### L. Pattern #20380 – GRE1 (stars):

Applique piece for leaf.

### M. Pattern #20380 – BRO1 (stars):

Cut two strips 2 1/2".



## PIECING INSTRUCTIONS:

### Jack-O-Lantern Block:

1. Follow the same instructions for piecing the jack-o-lantern block for the bag. Follow steps one through six (*Do not do step seven*).
2. Sew one [B] 1" x 8 1/2" to each side of the jack-o-lantern block. Press.
3. Sew one [B] 1" x 9 1/2" to the top and bottom. Press.
4. Sew one [J] 2" x 9 1/2" strip to each side. Press.
5. Sew one [J] 2" x 12 1/2" strip to the top and bottom. Press.

### Appliqué: (Templates on back page.)

1. Trace the face and leaf pattern pieces onto the paper side of fusible web. Cut out approximately 1/4" beyond traced line.
2. Iron each piece to the wrong side of the appropriate fabric following the manufacturer's directions.
3. Cut each piece along the traced line, peel the paper off, and lay on pumpkin block following the photo. Iron in place.
4. Appliqué each piece using your favorite stitch.

## FINISHING:

1. Layer quilt top, batting and backing.
2. Baste and quilt as desired.
3. Trim layers even with quilt top.
4. Join the two [M] binding strips and sew to quilt using your favorite method.
5. Hand-sew the two black buttons on for eyes.
6. Make a hanging sleeve and attach to back of quilt, if desired.

# Trick-or-Treat Bag

Finished size approximately 10" x 4" x 12"

## FABRIC REQUIREMENTS:

A. Pattern #20378 – MUL11	.....	Fat Quarter
B. Pattern #20379 – MUL1	.....	1/8 yard
C. Pattern #20380 – LTBE11	.....	Fat Quarter
D. Pattern #20380 – YEL1	.....	Fat Eighth
E. Pattern #20380 – ORA1	.....	1/8 yard
F. Pattern #20380 – RED1	.....	3/8 yard
G. Pattern #20380 – PUR1	.....	Fat Eighth
H. Pattern #20381 – BLA1	.....	1/8 yard
I. Pattern #20382 – GOL1	.....	1/8 yard
J. Pattern #20382 – RUS1	.....	Fat Eighth
K. Pattern #20387 – BRO1	.....	Fat Eighth
L. Pattern #20380 – GRE1:	.....	Very small piece will be needed for leaf appliqué.
Bag lining	.....	1/2 yard
Batting (approximately 18" x 34")	.....	plus small amount for handles & bag bottom

**Additional supplies:** 1/8 yard of fusible web, two 1/4" black buttons

## CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

Please read all instructions carefully before beginning. 1/4" seam allowance is included in measurements and all strips are cut across the width of the fabric unless noted otherwise. Label pieces and keep together until ready to sew.

### A. Pattern #20378 – MUL11 (character toss):

Fussy cut to center your favorite character in a 6 1/2" x 10 1/2" rectangle.

### B. Pattern #20379 – MUL1 (stripe):

Cut one 2 1/2" x 28 1/2" strip.

### C. Pattern #20380 – LTBE11 (stars):

1. Cut one 3 1/2" x 4" rectangle.
2. Cut one 3 1/2" x 3" rectangle.



3. Cut six 1 1/2" squares.
4. Cut two 2" squares.
5. Cut one 8 1/2" x 10 1/2" rectangle.
6. Cut one 8" x 12" rectangle.

### D. Pattern #20380 – YEL1 (stars):

1. Cut one strip 3 1/2"; subcut two 3 1/2 x 1 1/2" and two 3 1/2 x 2 1/2".
2. Reserve small amount for face applique.

### E. Pattern #20380 – ORA1 (stars):

1. Cut one strip 1"; then subcut two 1" x 3 1/2" and one 1" x 28 1/2".
2. Cut two 1 1/2" x 8 1/2" rectangles.
3. Cut one 2 1/2" x 10 1/2" rectangle.

### F. Pattern #20380 – RED1 (stars):

1. Cut one 2 1/2" strip; subcut two 21" strips.
2. Cut two 5" x 11" rectangles.
3. Cut one 2 1/2" strip for binding.

### G. Pattern #20380 – PUR1 (stars):

1. Cut four 2" x 5" rectangles.
2. Cut four 1" x 4" rectangles.
3. Cut four 1 1/2" squares.

### H. Pattern #20381 – BLA1 (dots):

Cut one 2" x 28 1/2" strip.

### I. Pattern #20382 – GOL1 (spiders):

Cut one 2 1/2" strip; subcut two 21".

### J. Pattern #20382 – RUS1 (spiders):

Cut one 5 1/2" x 8 1/2" rectangle.

### K. Pattern #20387 – BRO1 (bats):

1. Cut one 2 1/2" square.
2. Cut one 1 1/2" square.
3. Cut two 1 1/2" x 5" rectangle.

### L. Pattern #20380 – GRE1 (stars):

Leaf appliqué.



## PIECING INSTRUCTIONS:

### Jack-O-Lantern Block (bag front):

1. Refer to Figure 1 and with right sides together, place a [C] 1½" square on the upper left corner of a [K] 2½" square. Sew a diagonal line as shown (draw line first, if needed). Trim seam to ¼" and press. Repeat for upper right and lower right corners.
2. Sew one [K] 1½" square to one [C] 1½" square. Press.
3. Sew the two segments together as shown in last step of Figure 1.
4. Using the same method from step 1 and following Figure 2, sew one [C] 1½" to the upper right and lower left corners of [J] 5½" x 8½". Sew one [C] 2" square to the upper left and lower right corners. Press.
5. Piece together the remainder of the block as shown in Figure 3. Add one piece [C] 3½" x 4" to the left side of the stem block, and one piece [C] 3" x 3½" to the right side. Press.
6. Sew the pumpkin piece to the bottom of the block and press.
7. Sew one [E] 1½" x 8½" to each side of the block. Press.

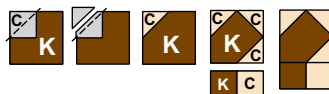

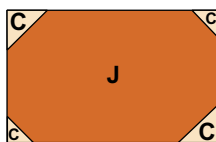

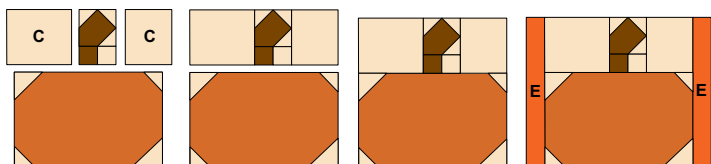

### Broom Block (bag sides):

1. Refer to Figure 4 and with right sides together, place a [G] 1½" square on top of a [D] 1½" x 3½" rectangle. Sew a diagonal line as shown (draw line first, if needed). Trim seam to ¼" and press. Repeat for the opposite end of rectangle. Press.

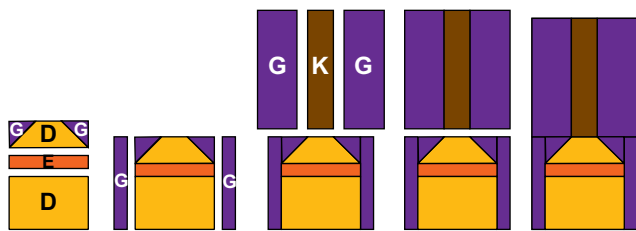


Figure 5 Make 2.

2. Refer to Figure 5 to sew [E] 1" x 3½" to the bottom of the [D/G] unit from Figure 4. Press. Sew [D] 2½" x 3½" to the bottom of the unit. Press.
3. Sew one [G] 1" x 4" to each side of the block. Press.
4. Sew one [G] 2" x 5" to each side of [K] 1½" x 5" and press. Sew this unit to the top of the lower broom unit. Press. Make 2 broom blocks.

### Making the Pocket (bag back):

1. Layer [C] 8" x 12" (right side down) with a 8" x 12" piece of batting and then [A] 6½" x 10½" (right side up). Baste and quilt as desired. Trim the backing and batting even with the front.
2. Bind the top edge of the pocket using [E] 2½" x 10½" by folding the piece in half lengthwise and sewing to the front edge of the pocket (Figure 6). Fold to the back of the pocket and hand-sew in place.

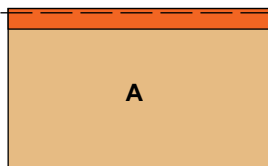

### Piecing the Bag Front:

1. Following Figure 7, sew one broom block to each side of the jack-o-lantern block. Press.
2. Lay the quilted pocket on top of the [C] 8½" x 10½" rectangle matching the

bottom edges, right sides up, and pin together. Sew these to the right edge of the broom block. Press.

3. Sew [B] 2½" x 28½" strip to the bottom of the block and press.
4. Sew [E] 1" x 28½" strip to the top of the block. Press.
5. Sew [H] 2" x 28½" to the top of strip [E]. Press.

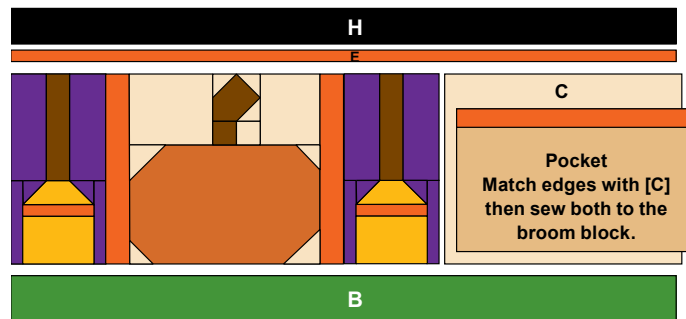

### Appliqué for pumpkin face and leaf: (Templates on back page.)

1. Trace the face and leaf pattern pieces onto the paper side of fusible web. Cut out approximately ¼" beyond traced line.
2. Iron each piece to the wrong side of the appropriate fabric following the manufacturer's directions.
3. Cut each piece along the traced line, peel the paper off, and lay on pumpkin block following the photo of the bag. Iron in place.
4. Applique each piece using your favorite stitch.

### Putting the Bag Together:

1. Your lining material and batting should be cut to approximately 18" x 34". Layer your bag with lining material on bottom (right side down), then batting, then bag front (right side up).
2. Quilt as desired.
3. Trim layers even with bag front. (If you want multiple compartments for your pocket, sew lines now running from the top edge of the pocket binding down to the bottom edge of the pocket. You can customize the size of compartments for flashlights, magic wands, etc.!)
4. Fold your bag in half (matching the two 10½" sides), and sew with right sides together. Use a zig-zag or finishing stitch along the edge.
5. For the bag bottom, sandwich two [F] 5" x 11" with a piece of batting in the middle. Quilt as desired. Trim to 4" x 10".
6. With the bag still wrong-side-out, pin the bag bottom to the bottom edges of the bag, right sides together. The 4" sides of the bag bottom will line up with the broom blocks.
7. Sew the two together using ¼" seam and turn the bag right-side-out.
8. To make the handles, layer one piece of batting cut to 2½" x 21", then one [F] 2½" x 21" strip (right side up) and one [I] 2½" x 21" strip on top (right side down).
9. Sew ¼" seam along the right and left sides, leaving the ends open for turning. Trim the batting down to ⅛" from seam and turn the handle right-side-out.

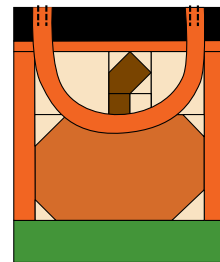

10. Press the handles and topstitch ¼" from all edges.
11. Pin the handles to the top edge of the bag as shown in Figure 8.
12. Bind the top edge of the bag.
13. Hand-sew two black buttons on for eyes.



# Wall Hanging

Finished size approximately 31½" x 50½"



## FABRIC REQUIREMENTS:

A. Pattern #20377- MUL1	1 panel
B. Pattern #20379- MUL1	½ yard
C. Pattern #20380- RED1	¾ yard
D. Pattern #20381- BLA1	¼ yard
Backing of choice	1½ yard
Batting	37" x 56"
	approximately

## CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

### A. Pattern #20377 – MUL1 (panel):

Cut panel 22½" x 42".

### B. Pattern #20379 – MUL1 (stripe):

Cut five strips 2½".

### C. Pattern #20380 – RED1 (stars):

Cut five strips 3½"; subcut two strips to 31½"; sew the other three together and then subcut two strips 43½".

### D. Pattern #20381 – BLA1 (dots):

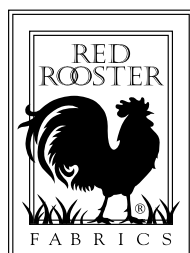
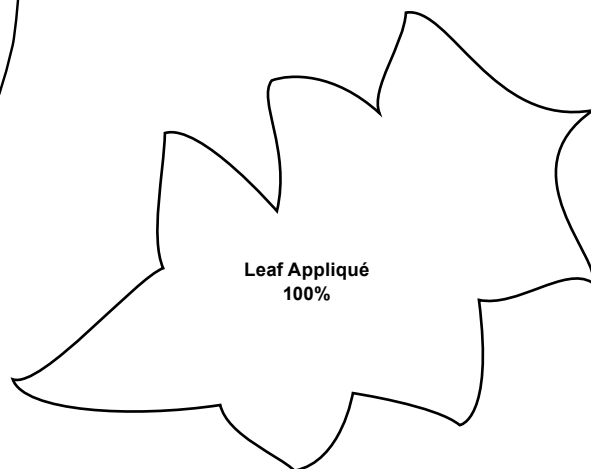
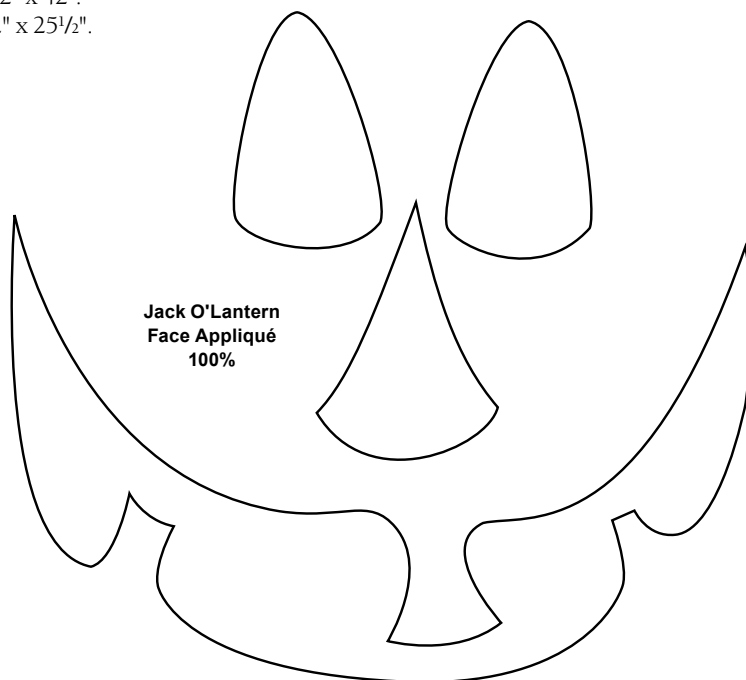
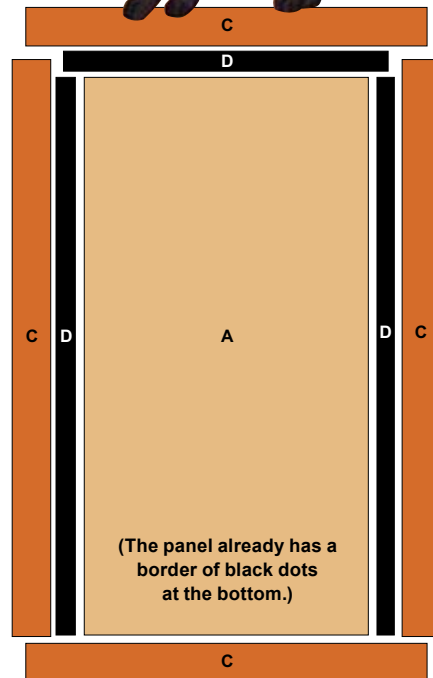
1. Cut two strips 2" x 42".
2. Cut one strip 2" x 25½".

## PIECING INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Sew one [D] 2" x 42" strip to each side of the panel. Press.
2. Sew one [D] 2" x 25½" strip to the top and press.
3. Sew one [C] 3½" x 43½" strip to each side of the quilt. Press.
4. Sew one [C] 3½" x 31½" strip to the top and one to the bottom. Press.

## FINISHING:

1. Layer quilt top, batting and backing.
2. Baste and quilt as desired.
3. Trim layers even with top.
4. Join binding strips [B] and sew binding to quilt using your favorite method.
5. Make a hanging sleeve, if desired.



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
